### FUNDRAISER AT BRUNO JAMAIS

Englewood resident **Bruno Jamais** hosted a star-studded magazine launch party at his **Bruno Jamais** Restaurant Night Club in New York to launch **Skin Deep**, a magazine about cosmetic plastic surgery and skin care. The event, co-hosted by Englewood Mayor Michael Wildes, included a silent auction of a dinner for two at Michael Bittan's 201 Supper Club in Englewood. All proceeds from the auction were donated to the Englewood Community Chest at the request of Wildes.
